This is the Lincoln's Inn Fields entrance, with a ramp on the right of the entrance.

This is the room where family activities and school workshops run.

There is no natural daylight in the museum, a dim environment is necessary to conserve the specimens and fragile objects.



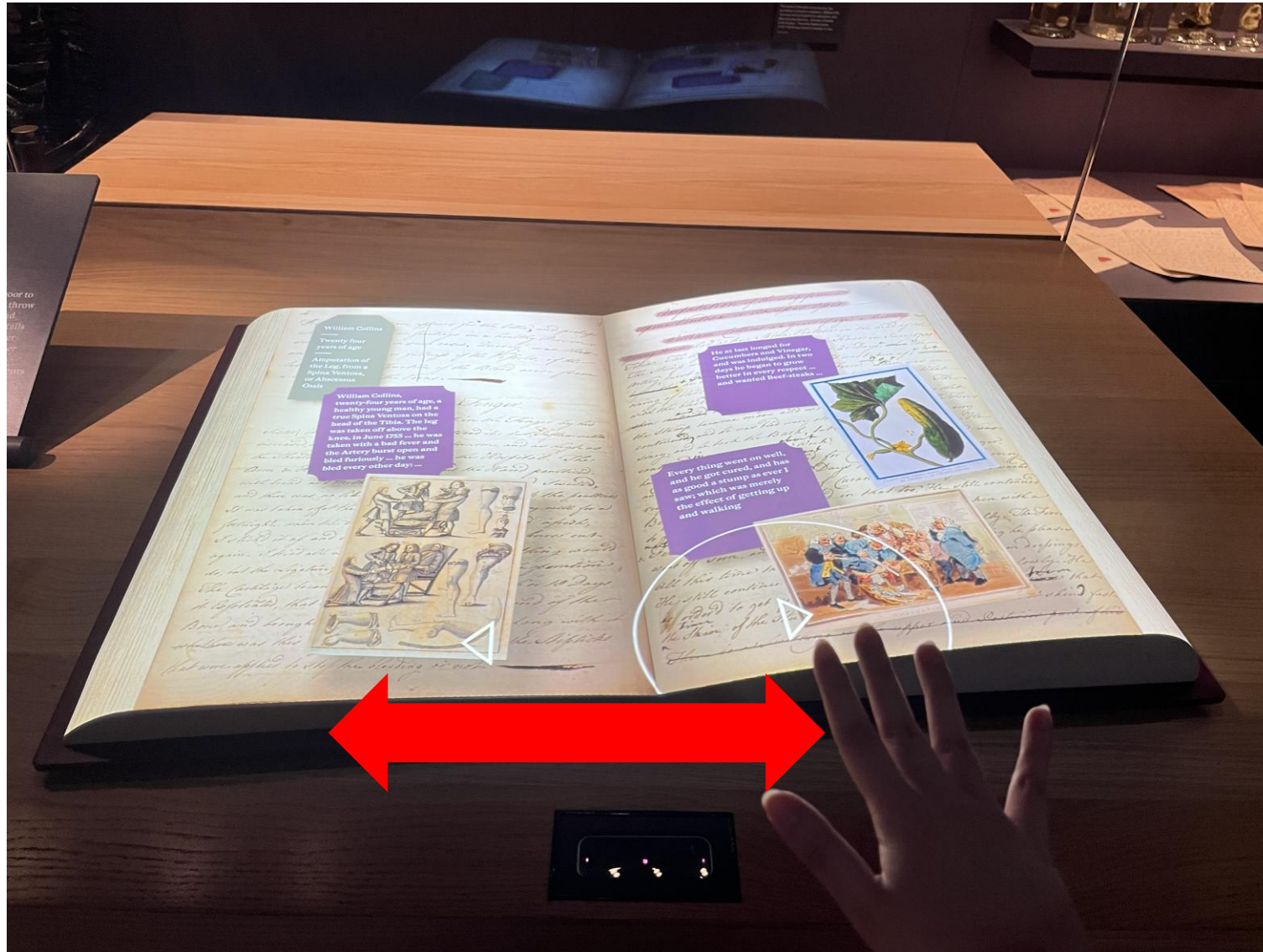
You will see many specimens in jars inside the gallery, including animals, insects and human remain.
